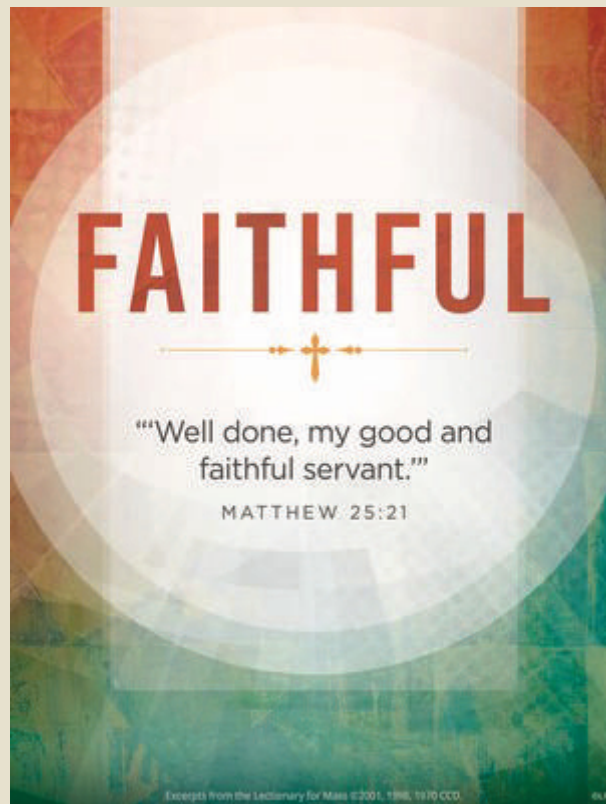

The Stock Market and the Spiritual Life Stock

I must confess that I am not talking here as an expert in either the stock business or the spiritual one either. But based on my personal observation and experience, it seems that there are some similarities and differences between the two paths to success and stability.

When it comes to investing our money in the stock market, we do so carefully and prudently. We try to invest more money in companies that are reliable and profitable. Sometimes we even look for advice from financial advisers who are trained in moving money around successfully. Every day we check to see how well or poorly Wall Street is doing to determine whether we are winning or losing.

I believe it's the same in our spiritual life stock. All Christians must be careful where and how they are investing their spiritual assets, which are their time, talent, and treasure. Any smart Christian knows that they have to invest their gifts in things that matter. They look for ministerial and charitable ways to invest their spiritual stock so that they can become successful Christians.

In contrast to the stock market, the good news for Christians who are willing to take the leap of faith to invest in the spiritual market is that **they cannot lose**. The only way they can lose is if they don't invest their time, talent, and treasure in the the vineyard of the Lord. When it comes to God's stock market, the more you invest, the more you make. There is no inflation in His stock market, which should give us peace of mind.

Matthew chapter 6:19-20 says, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."

When we invest in the stock market, we calculate the value which is a universal language. We know if we invest a certain amount, we will get a certain amount in return. Everything is transactional in life, even in spiritual matters in our relationship with God. But oftentimes it's more appealing and feels safer to trade in real life experience than trading with God because we cannot see Him.

God's bank is not tangible; his stock market is not as accessible as a click on our smartphones. Matthew urges us to invest in the heavenly and spiritual market anyway. He reminds us that spiritual investments are far more important and safe than any physical or financial investment we can make. When you invest your assets and gifts in spiritual things, you will never lose; you will never go bankrupt because you will profit a hundredfold.

I came across an article in which the author talks about a few ways you can make spiritual investments.

Investment #1: Time in God's Presence

He says there is no greater spiritual reward than being replenished and refreshed by God's presence. David understood this and declared in Psalm 84:10, "For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness." That means as we invest in God's presence, we gain spiritual wealth and even physical ones as well.

Investment #2: Godly Relationships

God is a relational God and commands us to be relational as well. The two commands that Jesus gave us pertain to relationships—Loving God with all our heart, mind and soul and loving our neighbor as ourselves. When we grow in our relationship with others in a Godly manner, we invest in our spirits and the spirits of others and that's the way our stocks grow in the heavenly market.

Investment #3: Christ-Like Character

The author says that a Christ-like character is an asset that every Christian must desire. While we can never be genuinely like Christ, we can do our best to become increasingly like Him.

Investment #4: Spiritual Gifts

The same way you might have a gift or talent that you have invested in and received a great return on your investment, we also have God-given spiritual gifts that can be extremely rewarding. We are called by God to use these gifts to honor Him and bless others. That's the way we make spiritual deposits that will bring greater rewards at the end of our journey of faith.

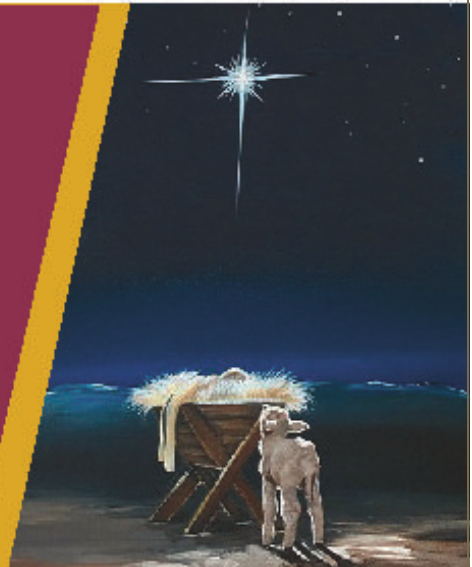

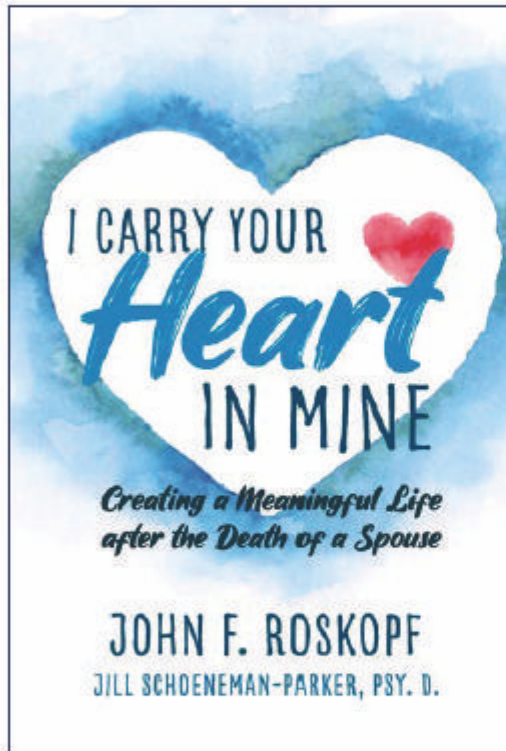

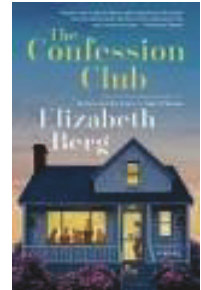
