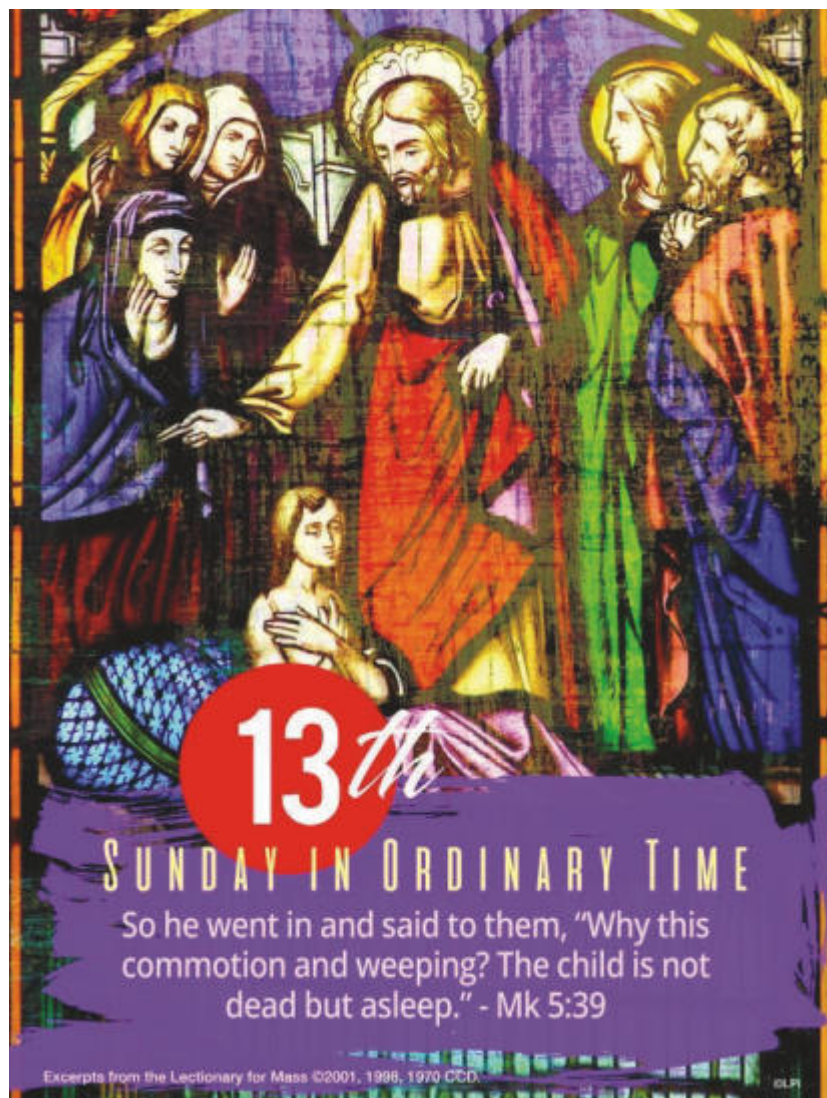

Dear Friends,

For weeks we have been reflecting, in Saint Mark's Gospel, on faith or lack thereof. Our God offers the gift of faith. It is up to us to accept it. Acceptance of the gift of faith brings with it freedom and responsibility. With faith, we can be free, free from the slavery to sin, free from fear, free from anxiety of uncertain future, free from guilt and shame over past transgressions. Faith frees us. It also calls us to use our freedoms in a way that would please the giver of faith, the giver of freedom.

Whenever I read today's Gospel, the woman with the hemorrhage, with her faith and her boldness, impresses me. First, she hears about Jesus and seeks him out. Exhausted from all the attempts to find a cure and financially destitute from the expense of it all, she could have fallen into despair. She hears about Jesus and in faith seeks him out. "If I just touch his clothes," she said, "I shall be cured." Breaking barriers, boldly approaching, she touches his clothes. In her encounter with Jesus, he commends her faith and reminds her that it is her faith that has saved her. He sends her freely on her way. Faith and freedom go hand in hand.

Last week, we recognized a not-so-new holiday called Juneteenth, a celebration of the end of slavery in America. I hadn't ever heard of that holiday until it auto populated my iPhone calendar a few years ago. Now, next year it will be a national holiday. It celebrates freedom. Next weekend, we mark Independence Day, the Fourth of July, another celebration of freedom and liberation. With freedom, though, comes responsibility. All the popes that have been in the papal office during my lifetime have challenged American government and the American people to take seriously the obligations and responsibility that come with the great freedom and blessings we receive as a nation. Saint John Paul II often spoke forthrightly and directly to our leaders and to us.

Almost 24 years ago, in his address to the new American Ambassador to the Holy See, then Pope John Paul II said about America and her freedom:

"No expression of today's [American] commitment to liberty and justice for all can be more basic than the protection offered to those in society who are most vulnerable. The United States of America was founded on the conviction that an inalienable right to life was a self-evident moral truth, fidelity to which was a primary criterion of social justice. The moral history of your country is the story of your people's efforts to widen the circle of inclusion in society, so that all Americans might enjoy the protection of law, participate in the responsibilities of citizenship, and have the opportunity to make a contribution to the common good. Whenever a certain category of people—the unborn or the sick and

old—are excluded from that protection, a deadly anarchy subverts the original understanding of justice. The credibility of the United States will depend more and more on its promotion of a genuine culture of life, and on a renewed commitment to building a world in which the weakest and most vulnerable are welcomed and protected."

With all that is happening in our Church and our country today, we need to revisit that message.



Faith-based freedom operates not in a vacuum, but in relationship with the liberator, the giver of freedom, the giver of life, the giver of the gift of faith. We are challenged to look at our own lives and our own exercise of liberty. Does my claim to freedom oppress another? Does my assertion of liberty limit another's? When we pledge allegiance to the flag, we pledge liberty and justice for ALL, not just for ourselves and those who are like us. Faith-based freedom accepts the responsibility of promoting the freedom and well-being of others, *especially those whose voice is hard to hear.*

From the pastor's desk... At the request of an enthusiastic lector at the end of the car Mass a couple of weeks ago, many of you have sent me your opinions about the car Mass, pro and con. Some of you thought Monsignor gave the request to email and call me. It was not him. Nonetheless, you were asked to share your opinion and you did. The letters and calls were mixed, and many of them sounded demanding, which was a bit disheartening after all the work that volunteers and staff have put in.

Allow me to say a few words about the car Mass. We were among the first in the Archdiocese to pivot and celebrate Mass so that the vulnerable could receive Communion. We've been doing it, rain sleet and snow, for nearly 60 weeks. Holding the car Mass involves additional hard work for the staff and volunteers, and their help is now needed in other areas of our fully reopened parish. We will monitor car Mass attendance and continue it over the summer if strong demand (demonstrated by attendance) exists. It **will not** be a permanent addition to our Mass schedule. Most likely by fall, we will return to Mass in Saint Joseph Church, enjoying the beautiful choirs of Saints JFX.

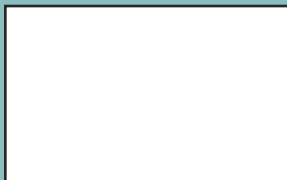
