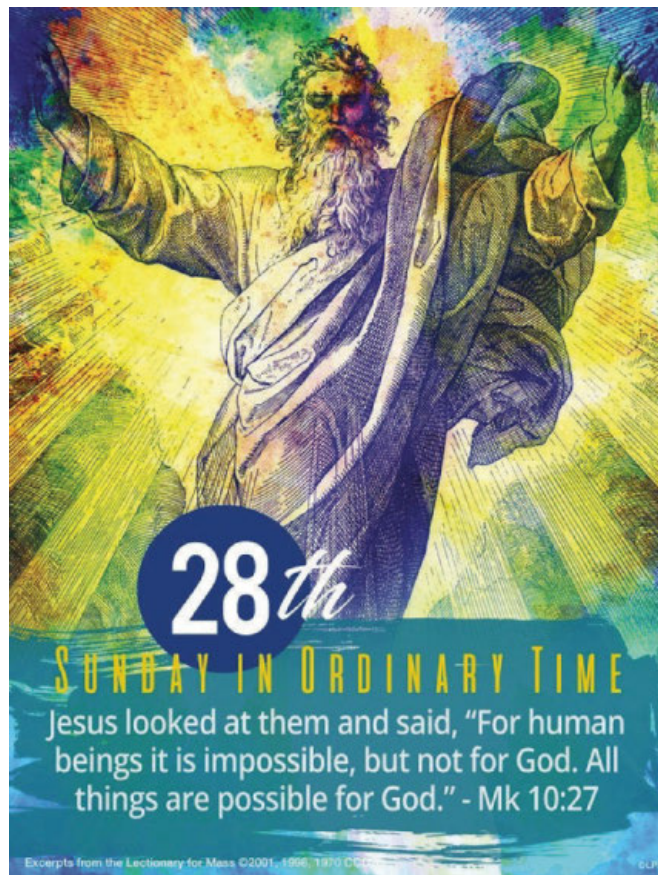

Dear Friends,

The words of Jesus should shake us. *“Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.”* These words, offered in love to a man who genuinely wanted to be a disciple, sent him away sad, because he had many possessions. This Gospel, which includes the reminder that with God all things are possible, encourages a spiritual detachment and life of generosity. My prayer is that we all use this Gospel to examine our own attachment to the passing things of life and our own practice of philanthropy and generosity.

I have a very wealthy friend who heard this Gospel as he sat in church one morning. He left church, sat in his car, and decided that he better start looking at his own attachments. Our world is better because he heard that Gospel. He started a family foundation and has been working ever since to give what he has to the poor. He doesn't do it for accolades; he does it out of a love for God and a desire to be happy with God in the world to come – for the treasure Jesus promises that will be in heaven.

This Gospel makes me think of a time when I had an opportunity to interview Cardinal George on camera discussing the importance of the work of Catholic Charities. He said something that day that will remain with me for the rest of my life. He said, “We all go to heaven on the backs of the poor. Jesus said, ‘They're going to get there first.’” The invitation to detachment and generosity offers a great reward. We often fail to respond to that invitation because we weigh our value on what we have. Cardinal George also said, “When we die, all that we will have is what we have given away.”

Growing up in a household of eleven, I never thought of our family situation as rich. But we were certainly blessed. My parents taught us that everything we have is a gift from God and is ours only if we choose to share it. Nothing belonged to “me.” It was God's gift to “us,” no matter who the “us” was. That unofficial stewardship motivated all that we did.

Even before they owned property in Illinois, as they were parents of five and tenants on the west side of Chicago, my parents purchased a little cottage in Wisconsin. They named the cottage, “Mi Casa Es Su Casa, “My House Is Your House.” They lived that moniker. All were welcome in that little house. Even though there was just one bathroom and a galley kitchen, sometimes we had twenty people lodged there. A new house stands on the site and the same sign hangs in front. And we try to honor the legacy by living the name. I'm so grateful for the lessons of generosity my parents taught us.

There's a family (maybe more than one) in this parish that practices that detachment, which lives generosity. The kids all work in the summers, as caddies and in other summer jobs. The parents teach their children that what they have,

what they earn, must be shared. So, every year since I've been here, in the fall I receive a contribution from each of the children. I know there's a formula: some of the earnings go to a college fund; some go to spending money; and some goes to help the Church or help the poor. I'm humbled and grateful every time I receive that gift from the children in that family.



When we live generously, God takes care of the rest. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that with God all things are possible. God turns hearts. God provides what we need. God tells us he will not leave us orphans. Attachment to money or to things or even to our own pleasures gets in the way of God accomplishing the great things God wants to accomplish in our lives. That's why Jesus told the one with many possessions to sell them and give to the poor. When we empty ourselves, God fills our emptiness with God's mercy and love.

Remember, with God all things are possible, including detachment and radical generosity. Let's live generously, follow Jesus, and have treasure in heaven!

From the Loft

This weekend at 5:00 pm Saturday Mass, our choir sings from the loft at St. Joseph Church. We've chosen an anthem that combines a treasured traditional hymn (*Amazing Grace*) with a more contemporary song (*My Chains are Gone*). Written about 1773, *Amazing Grace* was not originally a hymn. John Newton wrote it as a poem with some seven stanzas. A few hymnals include six original stanzas but most contain just four.

Chris Tomlin wanted to utilize one of the lesser-known verses; in fact, the one that is almost never published in hymnals. This basically unused stanza, which begins with the words "*The earth shall soon dissolve like snow,*" he simply made the final verse. Then he and Louis Giglio wrote a powerful chorus which, of course, *Amazing Grace* had never had. That chorus, which begins with the words "*My chains are gone*" became the subtitle of the new hymn.

Musically, careful listeners will also notice a new "feel" to this song. *Amazing Grace* was set to music that was in 3/4 time, which was quite popular in the 1700s, since it is the common musical meter of waltzes. With the chorus and new melody, however, *Amazing Grace (My Chains are Gone)* is in 4/4 time. This is the musical meter most often used, and is even called "common meter" at times.

If nothing else, this updated version proves that truth is timeless. *Amazing Grace* is a 240-year-old hymn, but the message of God's grace and the power of it are constantly new and needed. If we are saved by the grace of God, we truly have "been set free."
