

passage, I have been running around humming a song we with him. used to sing when I was in college. It is called simply, "In the breaking of the bread." The song contains striking lyrics.

"In the breaking of the bread, we have known him; we have been fed.

Jesus the stranger, Jesus the Lord, be our companion; be our hope"

The songwriter accomplishes two things with the refrain. He reminds us that the Risen Christ does not want to be a stranger, and makes a profession of faith and a petition for Divine assistance. He makes me think about my own devotion to the Eucharist, especially in this year of Eucharistic revival.

Do I recognize him in the breaking of the bread?

Do I know that Christ is truly present, alive, and coming to be with us at the Mass?

Aware of of all that life brings me, can I really trust Jesus to be my companion and my hope?

If I answer these questions with a "yes," as I presume, we would all like to do, then how does that call me to approach the Eucharist? I think a "yes" will demand a few things from us. Let's make our answers to the questions above real answers, not just words. Let's make our "yes" mean yes and approach the altar with reverence and awe. Let's commit to a life companioning with Jesus. He is our hope!

Recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread requires an attitude of awe. He is present, really present, in the simple form of bread and wine! The theologians call it "transubstantiation." I call it "gift." The recipients of the gift can only appreciate the gift when they open the gift with wonder and awe. Think of the love that God has for us. So great was God's love, that he sent his only Son, who not only lived and died for us, but he gave us the Eucharist, his Body and Blood, as a living memorial of that love.

This weekend the parish choir sings at St. Joseph Church at the 10:30 am Mass.




