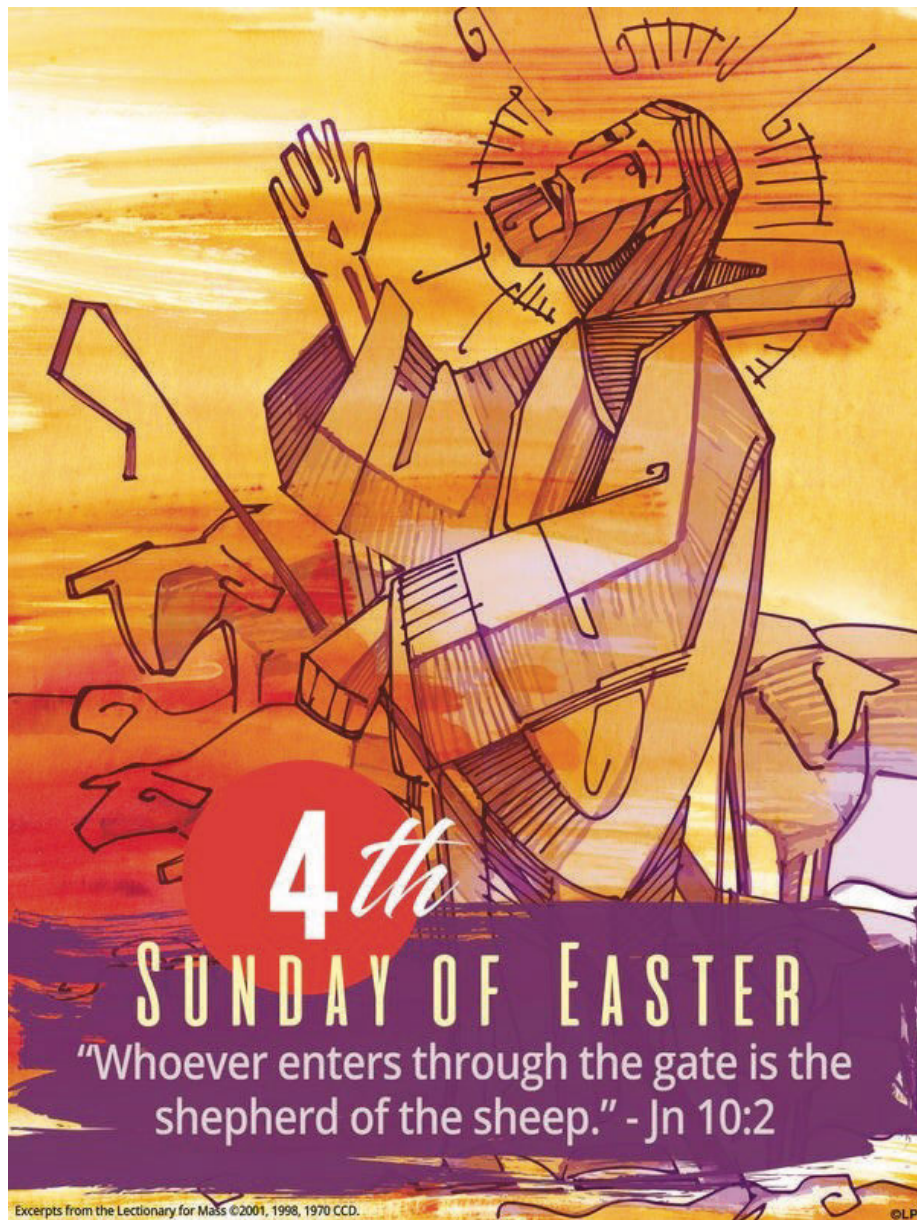

Dear Friends,

"Abbondanza." That great Italian word speaks volumes. My Italian friends, some of them in this parish, like that term. They use it to describe love, and they use it to describe food. You can hear "overflowing" in its sheer pronunciation.

Over the last five months, which seem to have flown by, from Advent to the Easter season, we have been remembering and recalling the events surrounding his Incarnation, ministry, Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Every time we gather for Holy Mass we remember and celebrate all these events. When we pray the Creed, we express our belief in these events. How often do we think of the "why" of these pivotal events in Salvation History? Jesus tells us in the Gospel today the real reason for his coming.

Today we hear a simple *why*. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, Jesus, the Shepherd and the Gate, tells us why. **"I came that they may have life and have it more abundantly."** He gives us abundant life. Are we open to receiving the abundance Jesus offers? Life in Christ brings life in abundance. The Psalmist tells us that if we allow the Lord to be our shepherd, if we allow the Lord to lead us in his way, we will want nothing indeed. Plenty will be ours. He will lavish grace, mercy, charity on his sheep.

To benefit from the abundance offered, we must submit to the direction and example of the Good Shepherd. We need to know through what gate we must enter. Jesus says that he is the Gate. He is the way. Too often though we refuse to be shepherded by anything but our own desires, agendas and passions. We want to make our own way. We want to take shortcuts and the easy way. The life of abundance requires submission and sacrifice. The gate is narrow. Following the Good Shepherd will sometimes lead us to uncertain places, to rugged pathways and to gates that we are unsure that we're able to open. It will, though, lead us to life.

We experience abundant life in the celebration of the Eucharist. Next weekend, we will invite over 100 Saints JFX children to the Table of Plenty for the very first time. Father Ryan and Dana have worked with these children, their teachers and their catechists, so I know they're ready to receive our Lord. What a gift! Their youthful enthusiasm and their joyful expectation are contagious. Allow their joy, their piety, their exuberance, and their sheer desire to infect you - especially if you have been away from the Sacraments for a while.

I beg the parents of these wonderful children to commit to bringing them to church every Sunday. Jesus came so that they, your children, could have life and have it more abundantly. Don't let any other schedules prevent you from allowing them to experience the life the Eucharist offers. I know they long for Jesus in the Eucharist.

Nothing should prevent them from welcoming Jesus into their lives each Sunday through reception of his Body and Blood. Our Mass schedule (especially the new 4:45pm Sunday Mass at Saint Joseph Church) accommodates the very full schedules of today's youth. Come, and feast regularly at the banquet and have abundant life!



From the Pastors Desk....

The Lakota group, the company helping with "The One Plan," our long-range Campus Master Plan, began its engagement sessions on Thursday and Friday. Leaders and representatives of councils, committees, boards, and clubs, as well as parishioners at large and other real and potential partners spent time sharing their opinions about what we need and want on our campuses. We will conduct larger "town hall" type meetings in the late spring or summer, to elicit feedback from all parishioners who wish to contribute their ideas. Stay tuned. We want to hear from you.

Join me in congratulating Father Ryan. Next weekend he will graduate from Mundelein Seminary's STL Program. He will receive a Licentiate in Sacred Theology. He has worked hard over the past couple years, balancing a busy schedule, with demanding parish and academic responsibilities. Now he just has a few more letters after his name.
