

Ultimately, on March 25, 1858, Mary revealed herself as the Immaculate Conception. That certainly got the priest's attention!

Lourdes. The Scriptures chosen for that Mass are beautiful. The Gospel was about the wedding feast at Cana. The back-and-forth between Jesus and Mary could be fodder for a stand-up comic. Many of the families and children suffer various forms of abuse and live in abject poverty. The Sisters provide basic essentials such as shelter, food, clothing, healthcare and education. The ministries are faced with many daily uncertainties including the threat of violence, which makes the work very challenging.

The Sisters work hard to continue to provide for many of the displaced families who have relocated to eastern Nigeria away from the threat of violence and abuse but are faced with different challenges of being in an unfamiliar territory. The goal is to provide them a safer and nurturing environment that will allow for growth, happiness and advancement in the education of their children.
