

St. Vincent de Paul Jail Ministry

Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart shared his concerns about the unique challenges facing men and women released suddenly from jail following a court appearance. Sheriff Dart explained that they may get released during a February blizzard wearing only the T-shirt and shorts that they had on when arrested the previous July, unaccompanied and without shelter. Many have been held because they have been unable to pay bail and are homeless.

Listening in the audience, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier Conference members felt a call to help. As founder St. Vincent de Paul said, "Charity is infinitely inventive."

The St. Vincent de Paul Jail Ministry began that day. Working with the Cook County Department of Corrections, we created a program that provides backpacks filled with personal hygiene items, underwear, socks, and seasonal wear such as warm coats. This past year, we gave 850 backpacks to the newly released after assembly by St. Vincent de Paul and other parish ministries such as the Women's Club and ACTION.

Recently, the program has expanded to give 100 backpacks to asylum seekers housed in the police stations. At one station, 20 pairs of steel toe work boots and heavy socks were also provided for men housed there, replacing their sandals, and allowing them to work as day laborers.



WHO WILL FILL THESE SHOES? Vocation event Nov. 24 for high school males






