

Medjugorje Presentation -January 11, 2024

Saints JFX Women's Club Guild 4 is hosting a talk on Medjugorje on January 11, 2024 to be given by Fr. Ryan. This talk is open to the entire parish and will take place in the Community Room at the St. Joseph campus at 7:00pm.

Medjugorje is a small village in Bosnia and Herzegovina, a former Yugoslav country. Since 1981, it's been reported that the Virgin Mary (a white form with a child in her arms) began appearing to a group of six teenagers (visionaries). The area has become a place of pilgrimage for millions of people. Three of these visionaries still receive daily apparitions and one of these is given a message from Our Lady for the world on the 25th day of each month. The remaining three visionaries have yearly apparitions. The Church has determined that the events at Medjugorje require further study to determine whether a supernatural character is present.

Fr. Ryan has conducted two pilgrimages to Medjugorje and will share his experiences with us. We hope you will join us.


