

When we make our will and our ways more important than God's ways and God's will, don't we show the same irreverence and disrespect? Do we give our Lord cause for righteous anger? Is it time for us to change?

> We can change when we reflect on the Cross. When we realize that Christ's ultimate act of obedience to the Father's will saved us and gave us an example by which we can live. We need to see the Cross as victory, and as love. Lent is the perfect time to do this.





Nicholas Caudell: Nicholas will be receiving the sacraments of Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation.




