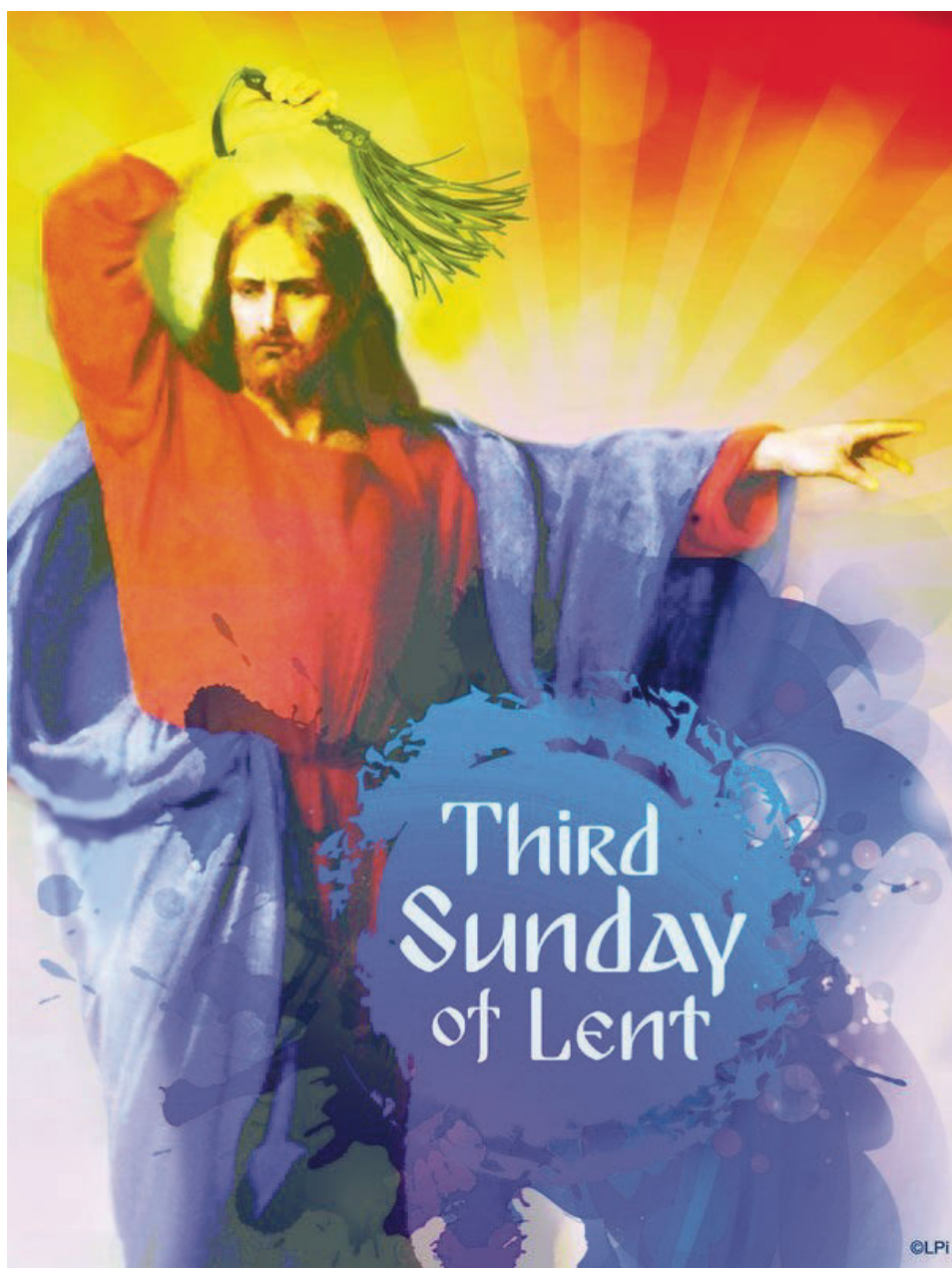

Dear Friends,

From the Pastor's Desk...

A week from Monday, March 11th, at 6:30 PM in the Saint Francis Xavier gym we will gather as a community for the presentation of the Saints JFX One plan. The One Plan is a cohesive master plan for the parish that will serve as a long-term vision and investment strategy to guide improvement and maintenance of our internal and external facilities. As I have said so often, this plan will educate a capital campaign. At the meeting, we will solicit your opinion regarding the priorities of the projects presented.

I encourage everyone to come to see the exciting vision we have for the future of our parish. We have heard the voices of our stakeholders, and this plan demonstrates what we have heard.

This weekend, we encounter, in the Sacred Scriptures, God who reminds us that he is God, and we are not. The readings depict a God who demands obedience and reverence. The Ten Commandments demand that we revere God, respect authority, live honestly, and respect others. I often remind the young people with whom I work that those laws given to Moses are not ten "suggestions" but Ten ***Commandments***.

Here they are...

"I, the LORD am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery.

You shall not have other gods besides me.

You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain.

Remember to keep holy the sabbath day.

Honor your father and your mother,

You shall not kill.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

You shall not covet anything else that belongs to him."

I have a friend who doesn't like to be told what to do. No matter what, when I tell my friend to meet at this place or another at a particular time, that friend often drives around the block for about 15 minutes so he can arrive on his own time. Maybe we're all a little like that. We don't want to be told what to do or how to live.

We want to be the ones to make orders. We want to be in control. We want to make our will be done. Today's readings rock our little boats. They move us out of our comfort zones. They urge us to humble ourselves and admit that we are not God! Listen to the strong voice of the Lord from the twentieth chapter of the book of Exodus.

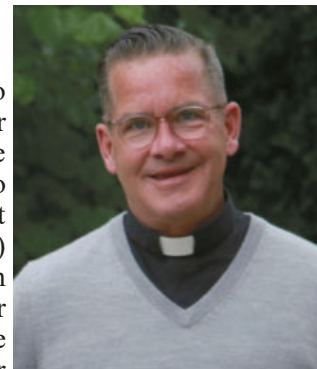
This *Torah*, or Law, given to Moses nearly 1300 BC, over three thousand years ago, set the stage for God's people to become a holy people. It established the covenant (again!) between God and the chosen people. Often though, even after their leader shared the words, the people turned from God. Their quest for holiness came second to their quest for other things. The Chosen peoples' own will strayed from God's will. And their actions had consequences.

The same goes today. Our liturgies remind us that we are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people God has chosen as his own. But we, too, allow our selfish will to get in the way of following God's commandments. We continue to rationalize our actions and refuse to allow anyone's (even God's!) rules to dictate the way we live our lives. We get offended when the Commandments, the Church, or anyone else challenges our way of life.

Jesus confronts the moneychangers, and those who were selling sheep, oxen, and doves, to reform their ways and their lives and to restore the reverence and respect due to the Temple. We witness his righteous anger over the corruption that invaded the holy place. As we do, we must ask ourselves our own attitude toward God's house (and God's ways, for that matter). When we make our will and our ways more important than God's ways and God's will, don't we show the same irreverence and disrespect? Do we give our Lord cause for righteous anger? Is it time for us to change?

We *can* change when we reflect on the Cross. When we realize that Christ's ultimate act of obedience to the Father's will saved us and gave us an example by which we can live. We need to see the Cross as victory, and as love. Lent is the perfect time to do this.

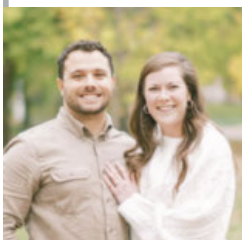

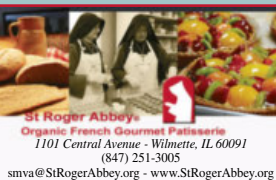
