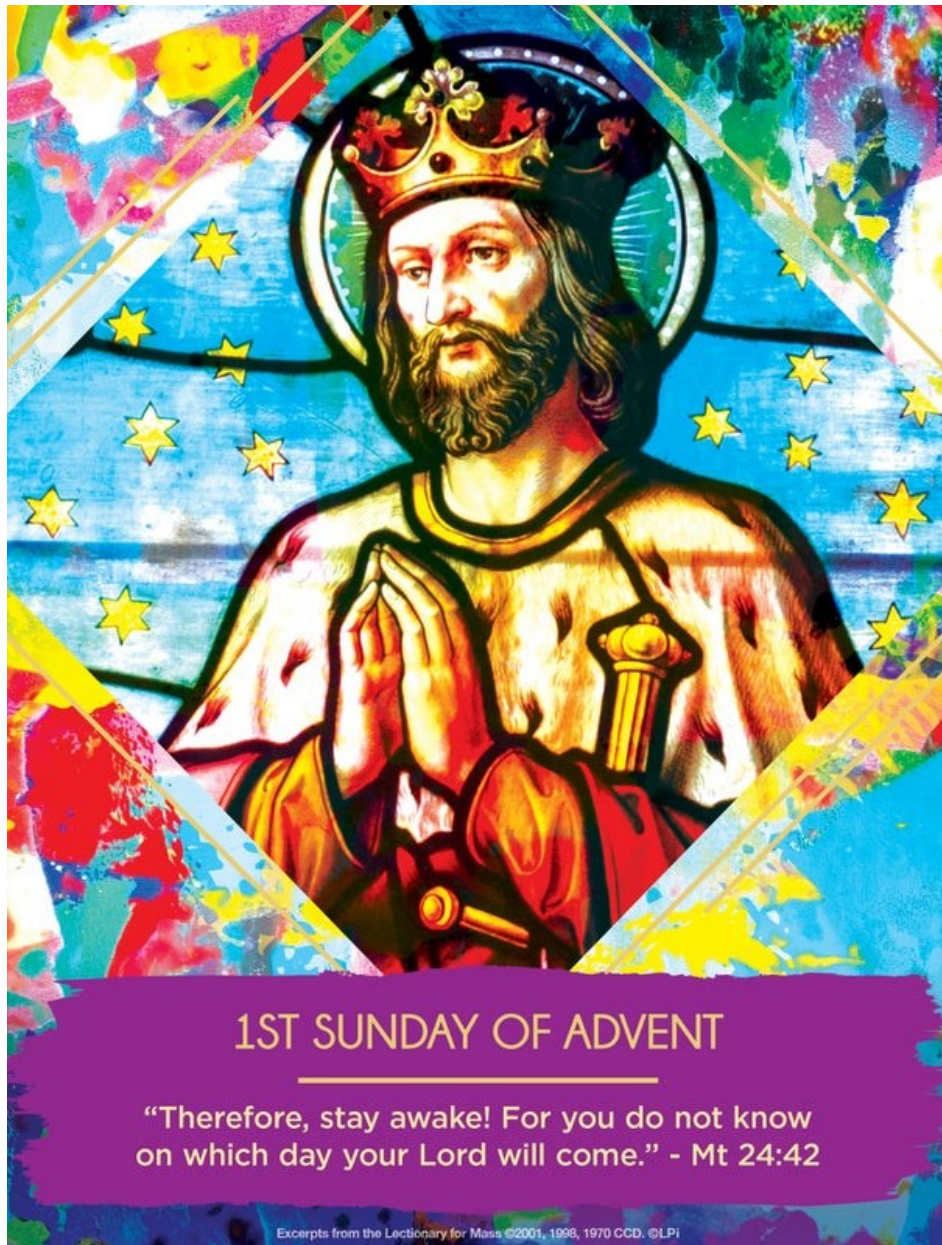

Dear Friends,

There's a song I remember from my childhood, written by a priest twenty years my senior, Father Carey Landry. I wouldn't say that I remember it for its musical brilliance, but for the simple lyrics which provide food for thought as we begin the Advent Season. Perhaps you remember it. The song, inspired by the Prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah is called *Abba, Father*. In the song we pray, "You are the potter; we are the clay. Mold us and fashion us, into the image of Jesus your Son." Isaiah, in today's first reading, announces that God will instruct us to beat weapons of destruction and violence into tools for cultivation and growth. The Potter desires an end to war and animosity, and a rebirth of mercy and kindness.

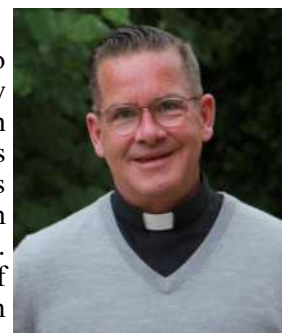
The beating of swords and spears can be done in many ways. Certainly, we work and pray for just gun laws and an end to gun violence and war. If we aim to fashion our lives after the God who calls us, and who sent his son as a little child, we ought to look at those "weapons of violence" as more than external instruments. Our tongues, and our fingers on the keyboards, need to be molded into instruments of love mercy and kindness. Our readings today set a tone of urgency. The hour to work on conversion in our lives is now.

Do we allow ourselves to be molded, to be fashioned by God? Or do we want to *be* the potter and form ourselves, fashion ourselves, into the image of whatever we want to be rather than what God wants us to be? When we become the potter, things get dicey. We can lose our way and wind up in darkness. Isaiah sensed that darkness and called upon the Lord to return - to mold and fashion a people gone astray.

Advent is a time to be reformed into the image of Jesus. It is a time of waiting, watching and being ready. Clearly this time gives us the opportunity to reflect on the darkness outside and our darkness inside. Our inside darkness, that part of us that refuses to be molded or fashioned, echoes the outside darkness of the short days and long nights of early December. If we are truly awake, watching and getting ready though, we will be drawn to the light, Advent candle by Advent candle.

But so many distractions blur our vision as we try to watch. Christmas parties start before the Thanksgiving turkey is digested. Everyone sprints, from now until the twenty fifth of December. In this race, we allow ourselves to lose focus, direction, and even get lost. We grow tired and even may be sleeping on our proverbial Christian jobs. Jesus says stay awake.

As clay molded by the potter into the image of Jesus, we probably will need to change some things in our lives. What in your life does not reflect the image of Jesus? It is the time to take a deep look within our individual and collective selves. Paul tells the Romans to throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light.



If we allow it, God will mold us. When God fashions us, God does so for a purpose. Let's slow down and take some time in these austere Advent days to discern that purpose. Aware of the purpose God has for us, we then can act. We can do God's will. We can be like Christ. As Zachariah told his son John, "You my child... will go before the Lord and prepare his way. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death and to guide our feet in the way of peace."

When we make it our aim to prepare the way of the Lord, in our own hearts, in our own homes, in the world in which we work, study, and play, the light of God's love does dawn on us. When we strive to please the Lord, our feet go in the way of peace. If we commit to doing that this Advent, hearts will be changed, and so will our world. The second verse of Father Landry's little song, simply pleads, "Father, may we be one with you, as He is in You and You are in Him." The answer to that prayer is YES, If, and only if, we allow ourselves to be molded, if we commit to preparing, and if we pledge to keep watch, and, of course, we model our lives on Christ's.

We are the clay, the work of God's hands. Stay Awake!

**St. Vincent de Paul: Offering a Hand to Those in Need**



- A retired entrepreneur in his 70s suffered severe injuries in an auto accident with an uninsured motorist. After months of rehab, he fell and required a hip replacement. He got behind in his ComEd bills and was placed on a budget plan. But instead of his monthly payment being reduced, his monthly bill increased by 49%! During a home visit, St. Vincent de Paul members joined the client in a conference call with a Com Ed representative. We advocated for the client and negotiated paying off the balance. St. Vincent de Paul paid the amount due so the client's lights could stay on, and he was no longer subject to increasing payments.
- A divorced mother of two young children was homeless while she downsized her family to a small apartment. She drove for Uber with a leased car on the brink of repossession during the school day to pay for basic living expenses. While delays in securing court-ordered child support from an abusive ex-husband hung in the balance, her family needed a place to stay until the move-in date of their cheaper apartment subsidized by New Trier Township. St. Vincent de Paul helped pay for her two-week hotel room stay until her move-in date. The Society partnered with New Trier Township who helped the family apply for Medicaid and SNAP food benefits and pay past due utility bills.
- A single mother of a New Trier High School student was scheduled for major surgery. Although she was employed, she had not been with the company long enough to have paid sick leave. She also worked two part-time jobs "just to make ends meet." To ensure that she could financially survive during her recuperative period, St. Vincent de Paul paid her outstanding utility bills and provided grocery store gift cards.

**Please help.** These folks are among the many people that we've assisted this past year. **We are preparing for a huge need for food assistance in response to reductions and denials of SNAP benefits (the nation's largest nutrition assistance program).** Father Wayne has designated this year's parish Thanksgiving collection for the benefit of St. Vincent de Paul. Please support our work that is needed more than ever by contributing via the QR code.
