Dear Friends,

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem. Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. God's light shines brightly in our community. The light of God's love, peace, mercy, and benevolence burnishes through all the good this parish does. Epiphany reminds us that the Christ child came for all people, not just a chosen few. The Magi came to know this. Realizing that he came for them too, and for their people, they offered him gifts.

We've been doing a lot offering of gifts lately. I think about two thousand passed through the rectory and the churches as we prepared for Christmas, providing gifts to the needy families of Catholic Charities. The generosity of the gift-givers amazed me. I thank the Women's Club for spearheading this project. Our school children and their families helped the students at our sharing parish school, Saint Thomas of Canterbury have a more joyful Christmas. So, as you offered gifts this year, you helped families that needed it this year more than ever. On their behalf, and on behalf of the staff of Saints JFX, I offer heartfelt thanks.

As we begin a new year, and celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, we can allow the magi to give us an example of perseverance, faith, and generosity. They longed to see the newborn king of the Jews. They followed the star. They never gave up. And, once they encountered the Christ, they offered him what they had. Too often we allow other things to take priority over encountering the Lord. We get too busy. Passing things take precedence. God-with-us waits for our encounter and we run about doing everything else. Jesus, no longer in a manger, but found in Sacred Scripture and on the Altar at Holy Mass, and in the tabernacle twenty-four hours a day, still awaits us. The Messiah resides in our encounters with the poor. Let's commit to paying him the homage the Magi did.

The magi inquire, ***"Where is the newborn King of the Jews?"*** ***"We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."*** The Magi recognized something special, went to great lengths to find him, shared what they had with him, listened to the messenger, and went home changed.

As we continue the holy season of Christmas and begin a new year, the Magi offer us a way of relating to the Lord. We need to look for God in our lives. Saint Ignatius invited Saint Francis Xavier and all those in his company to find God in all things. Beckoned or not beckoned, God is present. The Magi sensed something special about the newborn King of the Jews, so they sought him out. We can too. When we sense something awesome about God, we can find God when we look - in our daily lives, in the

wonders of nature, in the laughter of children, and in Sacraments of the Church. Seek the Lord. Do whatever it takes to find God. The Magi did - and were not disappointed!

The intention of the Magi was to do the Lord homage. This strikes me. I often find myself seeking, really seeking the Lord when I am in need. I think that is part of human nature. We have come to know and believe and love a provident God. Relying on God's providence we turn to God to provide for us, and he always does. On the other hand, the Magi are *not* going to *get* something from God; they go to *give* something to God - their worship and their love. They inspire me to be more lavish with my love and worship of God and to not only turn to God in need.

Our light has come. Jesus comes to dispel the darkness of sin and death. His light shines on the afflicted, the lonely and the afraid. This Epiphany feast reminds us that the coming of Jesus saves all, not just a few, and not the privileged and famous. All are welcome to bask in his light and to experience his glory. We must give light and love to the world. That way, we do Jesus homage.

Towering trees, mountain landscapes, our own Lake Michigan, an endless array of vegetative life, animals of all kinds, tireless insects...our earth is magnificent and it is in nature that I most feel the presence of God; a God who created such intricate beauty and gave us everything we need through the delicate, balanced, interconnected web of life.

Our insect population has declined more than 40% and consequently our birds, also nearly 40% since 1970. Today, there are 500 animals on the endangered species list. 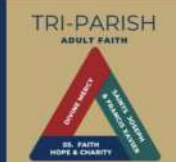

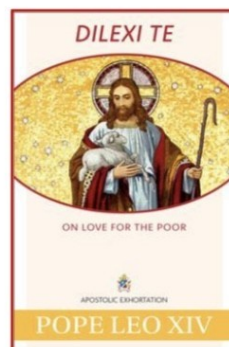

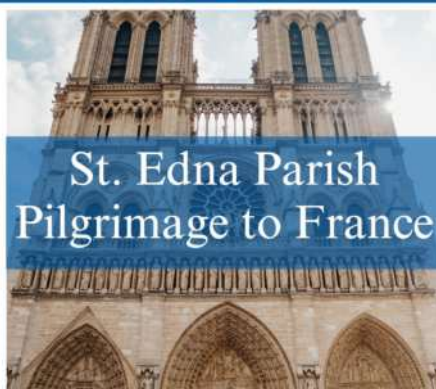
